How to call an ambulance 〈Don't panic. Speak clearly.〉

- ① Dial **119**.
- ② When asked "Kaji desuka(fire)? Kyūkyū desuka (emergency)?", answer "**kyūkyū desu**".
- ③ When asked "**basho?**", give them the address (building, floor, number) and/or major nearby landmarks.
- ④ When asked "**jōkyō?**", describe the issue in brief "**kōtsū jiko** (car accident), **mune ga kurushii** (chest pains), **kega wo shita** (an injury)".
- ⑤ Inform them of any chronic illnesses and the patient's medical history if you know it.
- ⑥ Answer to the best of your knowledge if asked about age, gender, or the condition of the injury.

~What to do during an earthquake?~

If a disaster strikes while you're at home

● Criteria for evacuating

If even one of these applies: Evacuate!


Evacuation alerts such as an evacuation order has been issued 	There is imminent danger such as a tsunami or landslide 	There is a risk of fire, gas leaks, or building collapse 	Lifelines have stopped, you have no supplies, so it is not possible to survive 	It is not safe to stay home

!The priority is protecting lives

When the shaking subsides after the earthquake, first go outside your home and calmly decide whether to evacuate. Regularly plan with your family on where to evacuate to in case of emergency.

● When and where to evacuate to?

In principle, evacuate to the "outdoors" to protect yourself from the collapse of houses after an earthquake occurs.



If a disaster strikes while you're not at home

● Criteria for sheltering in place instead of returning home

Your home is far away (more than 10km), making it hard to walk to	You cannot get water or food while on the move	You are wearing shoes that are bad for walking long distances	You don't have appropriate clothing or gear (For rain or snow)	You have illnesses such as heart problems or high blood pressure
				

! It is important to remain calm and to stay in place

When attempting to return home, your safety is most important. If a large tremor occurs while you are out, public transportation will stop and cars will be restricted, making it difficult to return home. Generally, the only means of transportation are walking or cycling. Considering the possibility of secondary disasters and accidents, **it is important to "stay in place" as much as possible until safety can be ensured.**

● Emergency Contact Information

When it is time to evacuate

● When to evacuate?

Alert level	Actions to take	Evacuate before the risk of flooding or landslides increases.
Evacuation Information		Actively seek out information and evacuate when the opportunity arises.
Alert Level 5 Ensuring safety in an emergency	Life threatening. Get to safety immediately!	
Alert Level 4 Everyone evacuates from unsafe places	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Start evacuating to a safe place In situations where going outside could be life-threatening, move to a safer place in your home 	► Evacuation Shelters The type of disaster (earthquake, flooding, heavy rainfall, etc.) is taken into account when deciding to open an evacuation shelter. Some shelters may only be available in specific cases.

Alert Level 3 The elderly evacuate from unsafe places	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Evacuate early for elderly people, people with disabilities, infants, or others who need time to evacuate. 	► Somewhere like a relative or friend's place outside of the city might be safer.

! In principle: Evacuate early ► be sure to evacuate by "Alert Level 4"

Sources of emergency information in the event of a disaster!

- If there is a risk of a natural disaster, or in the event of a disaster, first get information from TV and radio news.
- Battery-powered radios and, if rechargeable, mobile 1seg TVs are also useful in the event of a power outage. Mobile phones may also be used for emergency e-mail dispatches.

It is a good idea to prepare spare batteries and chargers on a regular basis so that you can obtain emergency information in any situation.

※ Pre-registration is unnecessary. Monthly usage and communication fees are free

**Earthquake Early Warning**

Intended to notify areas with strong (intensity 4 or higher) tremors in the event of an earthquake with an estimated maximum intensity 5 or above. After receiving the bulletin, do not panic but ensure your safety in accordance with the situation.
